Meditation on Lent

From: Days of Devotion: Daily Meditations from Pope John XXII

"I have said this to you, that in me you have peace. In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John16.33)

This meditation was written by the Sheppard of our Assembly; he could be speaking directly to us. Pope John writes:

LENT

The old problem of the connection between faith and works, which goes back to apostolic times, is coming more and more to the fore in our own day.

The answer is: not faith alone, but the perfect association of faith with works, and it is in his power of strong and enlightened faith, and according to his greater or less fervour in good works, that the worth of the perfect Christian may be seen, and he may be distinguished from the weaker men, the indolent, the ineffective and the unhappy....

From the Old Testament we all receive the command to "fight", each for his own salvation. What strong words these are: they teach us that it is our duty to fight until death against the temptations of the world in order to win salvation for our souls, and for the souls of all most dear to us in this life.

The New Testament gives us the words of Jesus, among the last He uttered before his sacrifice.

St. Patrick's Day Events

Tuesday 17 March 2009 is the St Patrick's Day Parade in Downtown Columbus. There are two requirements, The procession to Holy Cross and the Parade to Vets Center. I broke down the requirements below. This is a full regalia event and the District 3 K of C Float will be available at the parade step off point for those who cannot walk the distance. All K of C members are welcome to join the procession and parade. Dress warm as the day will be cool.

Details for the Day:

- The Procession will form at 8:45 AM on the Northwest corner of Rich St. and Grant Ave
- The Procession will step off at 9:00 AM and go west on Rich St. to Holy Cross Church
- Parking available at Franklin University Phillips Hall parking lot "D" located on the West side of Grant Ave. between Noble St. and Mound St.
- Shuttle bus from Vet's Memorial parking lot to the Procession staging area from 8:00 AM and will continue until 9:00 AM. The cost for this service is \$1.00 per person plus a Parade Badge (\$1.00)
- Mass will be celebrated at 9:30 AM
- Two shuttle buses in front of Holy Cross Church to take the Mass attendees to the Parade staging area.
- The Parade will form at Nationwide Blvd. and John H. McConnell Blvd. between 10:30am and 11:30am.
- There will be a shuttle bus running from Vet's Memorial to the Parade staging area from 9:15am until 10:15am. The cost of this service is \$1 per person plus a parade badge.
- The Parade will step off at 11:45am and proceed East on Nationwide Blvd. to High St., South on High St., to Broad St., West on Broad St. to Veteran's Memorial, where the Parade will disband at the direction of the Parade Marshal with the Shamrock Club's Annual Irish Family Reunion beginning soon after.
