Business Meeting Minutes

Meeting opened at: 7:30 PM

The Master Staff will coordinate a combined event this year as the "Father McGivney Dance Honoring the Past Faithful Navigators". This will be a business casual dance with 2nd Degree and 3rd Degree Knights invited. More details will be forthcoming.

VA Program: CW Higdon reported that on Veteran's Day November 11th, Applebee's offer free lunch to veterans, and the Golden Coral offers free dinner to veterans.

On November 6th the Knights of Columbus will have their float in the Veteran's Parade. The Master will sign the release of liabilities to the parade committee to allow participation.

It was also reported by Dave Baker and Shawn Ansbro that Assembly 2900 is 2nd in the Nation (behind Washington D.C.) in their reported Veteran's Activities. A strong and resounding "Thank-You" goes out to Jerry Lowery for his continued leadership in this arena!!!

Steve Valentine reported that Council 5253 at St. Pius will have 3 or 4 members going to the 2nd and 3rd Degree formation at St. Andrew's.





Saluting Our Veterans on Veterans Day, November 11, 2009

November 11, 2009 is Veterans day. What is Veterans day?

"Veterans Day is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it's always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)"

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle.

Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Also did you know that the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements. While these spellings are grammatically acceptable, the United States government has declared that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our council. The next time you see one of them, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.


