From the `Days of Devotion by Pope John XXIII

This is the Third of the series about the prayer the `Our Father`

‘GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD’

This is a great problem - the provision of our daily bread, and so it has its place in the program of Christian prayer and activity.

It is the Lord that gives us our food as the reward for every man’s toil. It is he who inspires the minds of innumerable people who with awakened consciences endeavor to discover the ways and means of creating prosperity, material wealth also, so that men’s bodies may be strong enough to be used for good purpose, and equal to the needs, the aspirations and the splendors of the soul.

We are certainly grieved and saddened when we see the willingness of many to draw light and strength from what the church teaches us for the solution of the great problems set by economic conditions and the search for temporal well-being. When light from heaven is shut out and men’s eyes are closed to the radiance of the Gospel commandments, which are the foundation of our Christian civilization, it is inevitable that the people should find themselves struggling in a vain endeavor even to improve economic conditions. These will never be able to provide true prosperity for human society, for this is to be sought in a wider interpretation of men’s needs.
