Business Meeting Minutes 16 February 2011

Meeting opened at: 7:30 PM

Roll of Officers: Faithful Friar, 1 and 3 year Trustee - Excused. All other Officers present.

Reading of the minutes: A motion was made by Gene Ebert and Seconded by Wayne Patterson to accept the minutes as published and read. Passed by all.

Faithful Friar's Report: No Report.

Faithful Navigator Report: Bo would like you to submit your email address when you sign in. The January Newsletter was sent out early. If you want to submit items of interest from your council into the Assembly Newsletter, send them to Jesus Garcia. If you need a hand moving items or need help around the house or other help contact the Assembly. There is new Regalia in the closet. To get Regalia on a 24 hour lease call the Marshall or the Pilot. No attendance from Council 11187 came to the Mass at St. Pius X that the Bishop celebrated. The new Fourth Degree Pins with the American Flag were passed out at the meeting and the pins will be available at the March meeting. Bo thanked Gene Ebert and his wife for the use of their laminating machine for the membership cards. Bo spoke on the set up of our room for the District 3 meeting. There will be 18 Seminarians taking their Fourth Degree in March. Assemblies will subsidize Seminarians for the event. Request for each Assembly provide funds for them. \$XXXX per Seminarian to take their Fourth Degree. At this time our Assembly will pay the cost for one Seminarian. Nuns Priests, and Seminarians do not pay for any event.

Dave Baker suggested we donate \$XXXX for our Seminarian for his Fourth Degree and that other Assemblies donate \$XXXX for each of their Seminarians.
