Happy Valentine's Day

Dear Brother SKs and Ladies:

An e-mail about the Sandy Hook School shootings was forwarded to me. Some of you may already know about it but others may not so I'm going to touch upon it briefly. One of the Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus team, Bill Wirtz and his wife, Joyce, lost a granddaughter, Allison Wyatt. The Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus planned to send a donation to a Memorial Fund set up for her and encouraged others to do the same. They also asked that Knights of Columbus and their Councils, Assemblies, and other organizations keep this family and others affected by this tragedy in their prayers. Specifically, a Three Hail Mary Prayer Drive, one for the victims and their families, one for the first responders and teachers, and one for the town to give them strength to support the afflicted.

At the January meeting, Deacon Hector Raymond agreed to lead the Social gathering in the Three Hail Mary's so that both Sir Knights and Ladies could participate, which he did after reading part of the e-mail as an introduction. A few days later, our activity was reported to the KofC 185 website as requested. They asked for the name of the organization, the location, the number of people present and the number of Hail Mary's said. They kept track of the totals and later their website could be accessed to see the results. As of the time of this report preparation, a total of 3,121,947 Hail Mary's had been sent by the 87,479 participants in this response. Also following receipt of each response, a "robo" Thank You along with an apology for not being able to send personal thank you because "we can really not thank you enough"!!

I sure all of you are aware that a 4th degree Exemplification will occur at the Cherry Valley Lodge in Newark, OH on April 5th and 6th, 2013. If you weren't, you are now!! We anticipate having at least 5 candidates from our Assembly, 3 from Council 5253 and 2 from Council 11187.

During the January Assembly meeting, considerable discussions were held about the possibility of supplying some level of financial support for each of the candidates. However, since the number of candidates was not certain and finalized, no "specifics" were arrived at, and were differed until the February meeting.

Some activities are moving ahead however. The Ladies of Assembly 2900 are putting together two Baskets which will provided for the Exemplification to be raffled off to help support the Ladies Program. Each Assembly is being encouraged to sell ads for the Masters Ad Book (10 full-page ads are desired).

Rooms at Cherry Valley Lodge are being reserved so don't wait too long!! The preliminary program is similar to previous Exemplifications with the Dinner Dance being held on April 5th evening, the Ladies program at noon on the 6th, the Exemplification at 1:30 pm on the 6th, the Master's Banquet at 7:00pm on the 6th, with other activities filling in between these activities. Further details will be forthcoming as they are developed and finalized
