Respect Life:- October is Respect Life Month

October is Respect Life month, so I thought I would update everyone on some of the news and events happening around here.

First, great news! As many of you have probably heard already, Dr Samuels' have decided to quit the abortion business. They announced in late September that they would no longer perform abortions at any of their facilities. No reason was given, but Columbus Right to Life attempted to verify this and it appears to be true. So, after 19 months of praying 3 days a week at their Pickerington facility, the Pick-Life group has ceased our prayer vigil.

Second, we recently received good news from the Ohio Department of Health: abortions in Ohio last year hit an all time low of 23,216. This is a 9% drop from 2012 and the lowest level since 1976, when record keeping first began and 18% less than 2010. The report also shows significant declines in teen abortions. It appears that the decrease is due to multiple reasons, including:

- A primary reason is the closing of 4 abortion mills last year.
- Decreased demand for abortions.
- Multiple pro-life provisions in the Ohio state budget in 2013.
- Persistent efforts of Pro-life groups across the state to educate Ohioans about the value of life.

Former Ohio State great Chris Spielman is the keynote speaker at the Lancaster PDHC fundraising banquet on October 21. I am sure I do not have to tell all you Buckeye fans about Chris, but he is a dynamic, committed speaker who is sure to move you with his testimony. This is a free dinner at Fairfield Christian Church in Lancaster from 6:30 to 9:00 PM but donations will be requested. Please contact PDHC at www.pdhc.org to reserve your spot

The 40 Days for Life event is underway. This is a national campaign to bring continuous prayer to local abortion mills in more than 500 cities across the world. In Columbus the program is sponsored by Greater Columbus Right to Life. This fall the vigil is being held at the Founders Women's Clinic at 1243 E. Broad St, Columbus. The 40 days will be from September 24 thru November 2. Seton has adopted October 21st from 7 am until 7 pm. We are asking that a minimum of two volunteers sign up to pray at the mill for each hour long shift. A sign-up sheet will be in the gathering space on the Respect Life table during the month of October. If you cannot pray on Oct 21, you are still welcome on any other day during the campaign.

We have an opportunity to help our local pregnancy center, PDHC during the month of October. PDHC is in need of diapers and we have been asked to purchase diapers that can be dropped off in the marked box in Hermann Hall. All sizes of diapers are needed.

Deacon Hector will be leading a Holy Hour for Life in the Eucharistic Adoration Chapel on October 24 from 6 - 7 pm. Please come pray with us.

The March for Life will be January 21-22, 2015, and we are already getting ready for the bus trip to DC. The bus and hotel have been reserved and the registration form updated. <u>Is this the year you can come with us?</u> Please consider coming to Washington DC to show our leaders how important life is and how wrong abortion is. As you can see, there is a lot going on! Please join us for as many of these events as possible - <u>only by standing up for life can we truly</u> return to a Culture of Life.
