Assembly Business Minutes - 10/19/22

The meeting started at 7:31 p.m. by Faithful Admiral SK David Evers with normal procedure and prayer.

Our Faithful Friar: Excused, no report. The approval of the 9/21/22 minutes was motioned and seconded. Voting ensured and approval followed.

Reading of bills and Communications: One bill for \$XXX was motioned, seconded and passed to the Trustees for approval and payment.

Our Veteran's Affair Liaison: No report, we will need a new Veteran's Affair Liaison to replace CW Higdon, if interested, contact the Faithful Navigator.

Trustees Report: SK Ralph Blamer, no report.

Report of Committees:

Culture of Life: SK Edd Chinnock mentioned that the 10/5/22 March for Life rally at the Capital was well attended. Seton Parish prayed at Planned Parenthood on 10/12/22 as part of the 40 Day Respect for Life, St. John XXIII will have their day on 10/30/22.

Membership & Retention: No report.

VA Raffle: SK David Evers has 6 raffle tickets left, \$10 each for the 50/50 Raffle to benefit Veterans, so far 164 tickets have been returned, drawing at the 11/16/22 meeting. Turn in sold tickets and money to him. Winner receives \$1,000 and balance will be used to benefit Veterans. Plans to provide a \$25 gift certificate to Knight selling the most tickets.

Unfinished Business:

SK Wayne Patterson and SK Phil Siedlecki are still in the process of creating a new formal procedure for the Flag Retirement ceremony.

FN David Evers talked about what we need to do with the Chalice Fund program for deceased members as the cost to purchase a chalice is now over \$XXX, engraving is an additional \$XXX. SK Michael Covey researched Catholic Cemeteries and had a KofC Assembly emblem grave marker, cost \$XXX, that could be placed on the

member's tombstone. SK Wayne Patterson had a K of C Memorial Plaque that could be hung on a wall, cost with engraving. SK Wayne Patterson presented a revised Fourth Degree Directive that will replace the Chalice Fund with the Memorial Fund giving each Sir Knight the option of choosing a MEMORAIL PLAQUE, or a K OF C GRAVE MARKER, or having a donation of \$100 given to a charitable organization of their choice. The Revised Directive form will be published in the November newsletter, plan to vote for approval on it at the November meeting. If approved, each Sir Knight will need to complete a new Directive form, plan to mail a copy with the 2023 dues invoice.

SK Bill Richards emailed the Assembly Officers on 8/18/22 an updated draft of the Assembly 2900 By-Laws, SK Michael Covey is in the process of reviewing them, when completed will present them to the Officers.

SK Wayne Patterson plans to invite Dustin Goodchild to a meeting to share his campus ministry "Saint Paul Outreach" at St. Thomas University in St. Paul, MN as we consider a donation.

New Business:

Saluting our Veterans

November 11, 2017 is Veterans day. What is Veterans day?

"Veterans Day is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it is always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)"

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Also did you know that the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements. While these spellings are grammatically acceptable, the United States government has declared that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our Assembly. The next time you see one of them, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.

Yes, the day of family, cooking, eating, football, and now shopping. But, I bet you did not know is a very Catholic and religious holiday. While it is attributed to the Puritan pilgrims in 1621, the first Thanksgiving was held on September 8, 1565 between the Native Americans and the Spaniards in St. Augustine, Florida with a feast and Holy Mass.

Then, the truly "First Thanksgiving" celebration on American soil occurred on April 30, 1598 in Texas when Don Juan de Oñate declared a day of Thanksgiving to be commemorated by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Fast forward a few years and the person credited with the "first" Thanksgiving, was Squanto, a Roman Catholic, that mediated between the Native Americans and the Puritan Pilgrims orchestrating what became known as Thanksgiving. But, the important part was that God was given thanks for all he provided to the people that came to this country.
